ASSIGNMENTS:

- ✓ 1. Read the Gospel of Matthew in a modern paraphrase, either Taylor's The Living Bible or Peterson's The Message.
- ✓ 2. Translate four chapters of Matthew from Greek into good English; include chapters 5 and 13. Read one of the commentaries listed above. — — also 7 and 19
- ✓ *TYPE* 3. Pick a topic that Matthew has a significant amount of material on (e.g., controversy, discipleship, fulfillment, kingdom, miracles, etc.) to notice especially as you read through Matthew. Take notes on this and prepare a theme survey of about 3 pages. Hand in at last class meeting (Feb 16). *No sources needed just B/C of mt.*
- ✓ *16 Date more commentaries* 4. Prepare a term paper of 8 to 12 pages (typed) on one incident or pericope in Matthew (not over 15 verses), explaining what is happening in the passage, what this tells us about Jesus (if appropriate) or what Jesus is teaching. Use Greek grammar and exegetical commentaries. Due Feb 2. *Evidence of looking at commentaries etc.*

GRADING:

1. A final exam on class lecture and the content of Matthew will count 1/3 the course grade. The term paper will count another 1/3. The topic survey, translation and reading will make up the rest of the grade.
